# **The Small Claims Court**

They give claims of up to €2000. You can go here if you feel like a complaint has not been heard correctly by the business you are in conflict with. You do not need a solicitor or legal aid. They will charge a fee of €15 and you can apply to them in local offices or through their website.

## Sale of Goods and Supply of Services Act 1980

### Goods

Goods must be of merchantable quality, fit for purpose, as described and match their samples.

#### Services

Services must be carried out with care and attention, the person doing the service should have the skills needed and the goods used must be of merchantable quality.

#### Redress

If you find that your good/service did not conform to the above regulations, you can be granted a repair, replacement or refund.

## **Consumer Protection Act 2007**

### Set Out Rules in Relation To:

- Claims made about goods/services: says that advertisements must be accurate. Misleading claims are illegal.
- Claims about prices they say that special prices are only available in certain branches this must be known to the consumer.
- Prohibited practices say that it is prohibited to run promotions when the prizes aren't available or offer 'free' prizes that you have to pay for.

- Aggressive practices makes it illegal to threaten someone when selling or use abusive language.
- Codes of practices they must be accepted by the Competition and Consumer Protection Commission (formerly known as the NCA).

#### The Competition and Consumer Protection Commission

The Consumer Protection Act established the CCPC. They have the power to:

- 1. Apply for prohibition orders to stop illegal happenings.
- 2. Give fines to businesses.
- 3. Publish a list of businesses convicted of criminal offences.
- 4. Give compliance notices.

#### Functions of the CCPC:

- Inform consumers via their website and shoppers rights cards.
- Enforce consumer law.
- Propose legislation.
- Investigate claims made against businesses.
- Publish findings.
